Matt Scharf – Thomas H. Wright, Jr. Lifetime Achievement Award. Recipient has shown leadership by example on the rehabilitation and the construction of compatible affordable houses in historic neighborhoods throughout the community.

Bruce Bowman – Katherine Howell Award – Recipient has displayed commitment, leadership, and service to the Historic Wilmington Foundation in helping promote the Foundation's mission and, consequently greatly benefited the community.

Thalian Hall Center for the Performing Arts – David Brinkley Preservationist of the Year Award. Recipient shows extraordinary preservation work of large scale, scope, and effort.

Curt and Sharon Stiles – Restoration/Rehabilitation Award for the renovation and rehabilitation of the Wright-Murphy House at 212 S. Second Street.

Town of Burgaw – Rehabilitation/Adaptive Reuse Award for the rehabilitation and conversion of the historic Burgaw Depot into a community facility.

James and Christine Beck – Restoration Award for the restoration of a small cottage at McRae Street for affordable housing.

Gregory Chandler and Bill Robertson – Rehabilitation Award for the rehabilitation of a Colonial Revival style house at 1808 Market Street.

St. Mary School and Church – Rehabilitation and Restoration Award for the complete restoration and rehabilitation of the Upper Room 1871, and restoration of wooden windows in the school building.

David Spetrino – Compatible New Infill Construction Award for the redevelopment of an Ice House and the surrounding yard at the corner of 6th and Brunswick streets.

Wilmington Railroad Museum – Merit Award for the adaptive reuse of the 1883 railroad warehouse at 506 Nutt Street.

Oakdale Cemetery – Merit Award for the construction of new compatible fencing along North 15th Street on the entrance to the cemetery.

Kevin Pfirman – Merit Award for the rehabilitation of a vernacular commercial building at 620 N. Fourth Street.
